

PASTOR'S NOTES

Sacrosanctum Concilium

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Vatican II, Series, Part 4
Fr. Brian Lager

6. Just as Christ was sent by the Father, so also He sent the apostles, filled with the Holy Spirit. This He did that, by preaching the gospel to every creature [14], they might proclaim that the Son of God, by His death and resurrection, had freed us from the power of Satan [15] and from death, and brought us into the kingdom of His Father. His purpose also was that they might accomplish the work of salvation which they had proclaimed, by means of sacrifice and sacraments, around which the entire liturgical life revolves. Thus by baptism men are plunged into the paschal mystery of Christ: they die with Him, are buried with Him, and rise with Him [16]; they receive the spirit of adoption as sons "in which we cry: Abba, Father" (Rom. 8:15), and thus become true adorers whom the Father seeks [17]. In like manner, as often as they eat the supper of the Lord they proclaim the death of the Lord until He comes [18]. For that reason, on the very day of Pentecost, when the Church appeared before the world, "those who received the word" of Peter "were baptized." And "they continued steadfastly in the teaching of the apostles and in the communion of the breaking of bread and in prayers . . . praising God and being in favor with all the people" (Acts 2:41-47). From that time onwards the Church has never failed to come together to celebrate the paschal mystery: reading those things "which were in all the scriptures concerning him" (Luke 24:27), celebrating the eucharist in which "the victory and triumph of his death are again made present" [19], and at the same time giving thanks "to God for his unspeakable gift" (2 Cor. 9:15) in Christ Jesus, "in praise of his glory" (Eph. 1:12), through the power of the Holy Spirit.

"They continued steadfastly in the teaching of the apostles and in the communion of the breaking of bread and in prayers." (Acts 2:42) after Jesus rose from the dead, ascended into heaven, and sent the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, these are the four key practices to which the early church dedicated themselves. We also still to this day understand these to be the basic foundations of our life in Christ. The teaching of the apostles is the dogmas and doctrines we believe and teach, the communion, or fellowship, is the community we build up with one another in parishes, the breaking of bread is the Mass we pray each week, and prayers is the liturgy of the hours that we are encouraged to pray, but also our individual prayers for one another outside of Mass. When we hold to these four main practices we know that we are holding to what was taught to the earliest disciples of Jesus and thus we as His disciple adhere today. From these we go out into the world and invite others so that the Church may grow and we help to fulfill the Great Commission.


ST. JOSEPH FOOD PANTRY

Thank you for your cooperation and patience in helping to keep one another safe and healthy as we adjust to these changing times. We are happy to welcome you back inside!



Stewardship Reflection

Do What Needs to Be Done

A friend recently confided in me that although he prayed frequently each day and was involved heavily in his parish, he did not sense much fruit coming from it all and was left feeling unsatisfied. I assured him he was not alone. I told him of a deceased pastor of mine who had spoken frequently about being in this type of situation. Even as a priest, he knew all too well of how we can feel like we are simply going through the motions. It is precisely at those times that continuing to pray and practicing good stewardship is most important, because it would be easier to simply take a break and risk never coming back. He liked to say, "Do the drill," meaning just do what needs to be done.

We are all called to be mature disciples who answer the call of Jesus Christ regardless of the cost. We cannot choose when and where the call will come. We cannot schedule our stewardship in a way that is always most convenient for us. Even when the fruits of our faithful efforts seem hidden from us, we hold to the promise that we are never called to give of ourselves for nothing. God is working through us and in us. No matter how dry the land may seem, seeds are being planted to yield a harvest greater than we can ever realize. Stay strong and do the drill!
