PAPAL JUBILEE of 1929

Deeply moved by the many felicitations offered him on the occasion of his Sacerdotal Jubilee, Dec. 20th, 1928, our gloriously reigning Pontiff, Pius 11th, has declared an extraordinary jubilee for all the faithful throughout the world in order that they too, as his children may participate in his joys.

This extraordinary jubilee began in January of the current year and will last until January 1, 1930. A Plenary Indulgence can be gained for oneself or for the poor soula in purgatory as often as the conditions prescribed are fulfilled. The conditions are:

1. The worthy reception of the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist.

2.Six visits to the Parish Church, in which vocal prayers are to be offered for the intentions of the Holy Father. During these visits prayers must be said for the intentions of the Holy Father, in general for the conversion of sinners, the extirpation of heresy and schism, and for peace and concord among all princes, to the end that the exaltation, prosperity and freedom of the Catholic Church and its Head, the Vicar of Jesus Christ, may the more easily be attained.

The intentions need not be known distinctly, nor need they be kept explicitly in mind; it suffices to pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.


Most writers on the Jubilee say that five Our Fathers and five Hail Marys, or the equivalent, are required. They all agree that this suffices.

3. Fast and abstinence on two days that are not regular fast and abstinence days.

4. Finally, after hearing the advice of a confessor, they must give alms for some work of religion, each according to his means and piety. The work of the Propagation and Preservation of the Faith is particularly commended by the Holy Father. The alms need not be given in the churches visited.
