We were greatly interested in reading "another" list of the ten greatest women in the world. We would revise the list just a little.

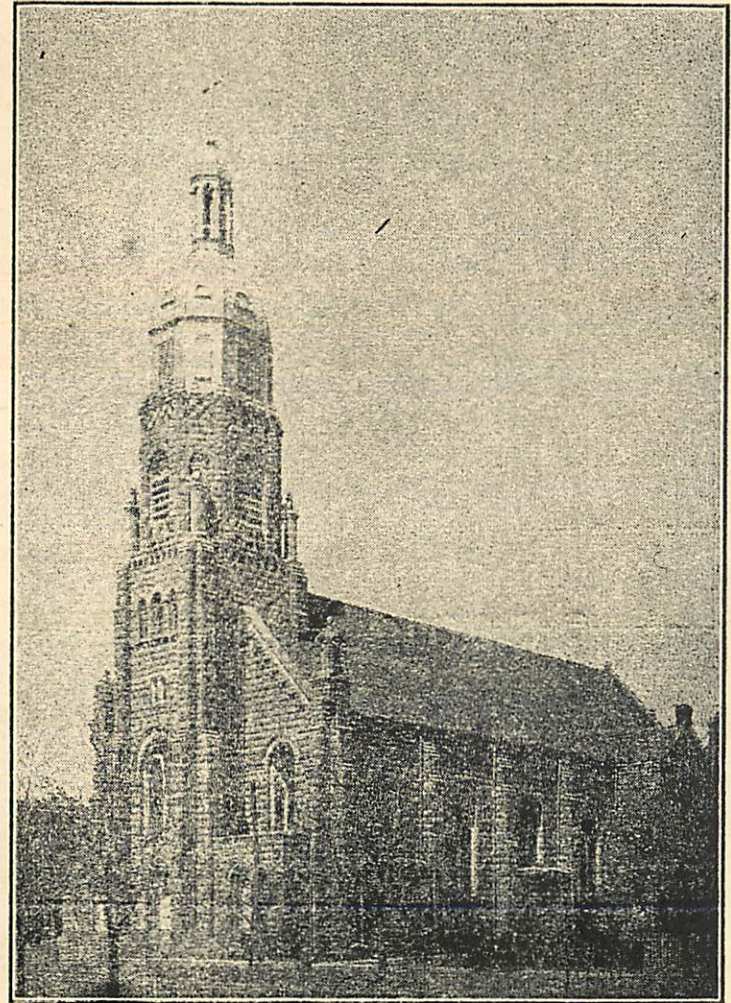
1. The mother who dresses, feeds, and cares for her children;
