

## **Pastor's Notes**

Fr. Brian Lager

Public Masses being cancelled throughout our diocese and the country makes it difficult for us to have the normal spiritual life that we are accustomed to having. I would like to you ten suggestions during this time to supplement your spiritual life.

- 1. There are several places that you can watch Mass online. EWTN, Bishop Robert Barron, and individual priests and parishes have already been offering online Mass.
- 2. Praying the Liturgy of the Hours. If you have never prayed this before you can download the free Ibreviary app on your phone and learn how to pray it. There are also online resources to teach you how.
- 3. The Rosary. The tradition of the Rosary began with praying 150 Hail Mary's, one for each psalm. We typically think of the 50 Hail Mary's that we pray. This is a great prayer that we can offer for the end of this virus.
- 4. Reading the scriptural readings for the weekday and the Sunday Mass. They can be found on the USCCB website.
- 5. Reading through the parts of the Mass without the consecration prayers. This deepens our devotion with the recognition that the essential parts to consecrate the Eucharist are missing and we need priests to do those parts. It teaches us to pray for an end of this quarantine as well as for an increase in vocations.
- 6. Lectio Divina. This practice of praying through the scriptures allows us to deepen our love for the scriptures which are the Word of God.
- 7. Spiritual Communion. This is a practice of Catholics that increases our desire to receive Jesus in the Eucharist when we physically cannot. My Jesus, I believe that Thou art present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love Thee above all things and I desire Thee in my soul. Since I cannot now receive Thee sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. As though Thou wert already there, I embrace Thee and unite myself wholly to Thee; permit not that I should ever be separated from Thee. Amen.
- 8. Making phone calls. When we cannot be in the physical presence of one another because of this virus, it is still important that we continue keeping in touch with others. With modern technology

- video phone calls are a great resource.
- 9. Stations of the Cross. Although gatherings of people in large groups is prohibited at this point, we can still come to the church and pray. The Stations of the Cross are a great way to unite our sufferings in these times to those of Christ.
- 10. Shut off the media. Spend time with your family. Let us look to the positive outcomes of these trying times. We have a great opportunity to grow in holiness and love of God and neighbor during these days.

These are unprecedented days that we are encountering. As a parish let us hold one another in prayer but also those in the medical field, and those in leadership positions making decisions for our good and the good of our world. Father Ryan and I will do our best to minister to you in these trying times. Please know that we will be available for Confessions at the usual times, and will be offering private masses for you and your intentions. May God bless you.


#### STWARDSHIP RENEWAL FORMS

#### Statement of Bishop Gerald L. Vincke Regarding Cancellation of Public Masses in the Diocese of Salina due to COVID-19

With deep sadness and in conjunction with the bishops of Kansas, effective 1 pm on March 17, 2020, and until further notice, all public celebrations of the Holy Mass in the Diocese of Salina are cancelled except for funeral Masses. Some of you will be understanding, others will be saddened, others angry, and others will feel like this decision is over-the-top and media driven. Please know that this decision was a very difficult one. In making this decision, we have the very young, the aged, and those most immune compromised in mind as we respect the dignity of every human person.

Confirmation Masses are postponed to a later date. Funeral Masses are limited to immediate family members. No funeral luncheons may be held. A funeral liturgy outside of Mass must be limited to immediate family members also. In addition to celebrating the funeral Mass or funeral liturgy outside of Mass, families and pastors are encouraged to schedule Memorial Masses for their loved ones in the future, when public health restrictions are relaxed, so that larger numbers may gather if desired. Priests are invited to continue to offer Mass privately for the Mass intentions scheduled.

All communal penance services are cancelled. Priests should continue as much as possible to offer individual confessions at regularly scheduled times. Confessions are to be heard only behind a screen or other barrier and not face to face. At no time should there be more than 10 people gathered in the church waiting for confession. Baptisms may continue but only parents, godparents and immediate family members who are asymptomatic may attend.

Confirmation Masses are postponed to a later date. Funeral Masses are limited to immediate family members. No funeral luncheons may be held. A funeral liturgy outside of Mass must be limited to immediate family members also. Please do not come to any of the above if you are sick, if you have been exposed to the coronavirus, if you suspect you have been exposed or if you have been advised by a doctor not to go out in public or attend public gatherings.

I know that many of you will feel that we are taking away Jesus when we need Him the most. Others will say that if we had more faith, all will be well. But the Lord also invites us to be prudent and charitable, too. I am encouraging all priests to keep the Church doors open as much as possible so that the faithful can pray. In many ways, we can unite ourselves with Jesus, who even more deeply felt abandoned even by his Heavenly Father during his agony.

I encourage all the faithful to continue to join in prayer for the health and protection of our entire community and nation, and for an end to this crisis. I encourage all families and individuals to pray the rosary, invoking the intercession and protection of our Blessed Mother, Health of the Sick, for these intentions and for the health and well-being of our brothers and sisters who are ill, for their caretakers, and for all doctors, nurses, medical and emergency preparedness personnel and elected officials. I also ask you to join in praying a novena to the Blessed Mother which began March 16 until the Annunciation on March 25. The prayer asking for her intercession is available on our website. Thank you. Please know that Masses will be available to watch on our website too.

May God bless you and your families with much peace and healing.



The small church was in financial difficulty. The parish treasurer had resigned. The parish debt seemed insurmountable. Salaries were not being paid, and little money was available for charity. In desperation, the pastor asked the local grain manager to help the church by serving as treasurer. Fine, the man agreed...but with two stipulations. First, there would be no treasurer's report for the first year. Second, there would be no questions for the first year. The pastor agreed and the man took the job, promising to make a full report after the first year.

The year came and went, and soon the new treasurer was preparing to give his report to the parish council. The news was good. The parish debt was gone. Salaries were up-to-date and employees even receive a raise. There was money in the parish account... and the parish's charitable donations had increased tenfold.

How did he do it?

The man grinned. "it wasn't hard at all. You all bring your grain to my elevator. Throughout the year, I simply withheld 10 percent on your behalf and gave it to the church."

"You did not even miss it."
