


+ Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

In the Liturgical year, the Church celebrates the whole mystery of Christ from the Incarnation until the day of Pentecost and the expectation of Christ's second coming. The summit of the Liturgical year is the **Easter Triduum-from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday**. Through chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal mystery. The presence of the risen Lord and his saving work permeates the entire Liturgical Year: Advent, the Christmas Season, Lent, the Easter Season and Ordinary time.

Palm Sunday and Symbolism

Sometimes, one of the hardest things to explain as a Catholic is our attachment to symbolism. Palm Sunday is a great example of that. We come home from Mass holding palm branches, and we tuck them behind a crucifix or next to the picture of the Last Supper. To anyone who does not know our faith, it looks as though we stuck a few weeds on the wall... imagine their questions! The truth behind this tradition, however, goes to the story of Palm Sunday, when the people heard that Christ was coming and "they took out palm branches and went out to meet him, and cried out 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, [even] the king of Israel." (John 12:13). It was a tradition to spread palms before a king as he processed into his city. It was a way to welcome him, to show him glory and homage. Thus, Christ, the true King, was welcomed into Jerusalem. This fulfilled the prophecy in the Old Testament, which declared, "Behold:



your king is coming to you, a just savior is he, humble and riding on a donkey." (Zech. 9:9) It revealed that Christ was a great king, but also a humble king. The people greeted him with wild joy and cheers of Hosanna. But one short week later, they crucified him. We celebrate this feast and carry palm branches home with us to commemorate the great humility of Our Lord, who loved us so much that he chose the cross for our salvation.

SAINTS / VENERABLES

St. Pedro Calungsod April 2

Saint Pedro Calungsod was born around the year 1654 in the Philippines somewhere in the Visayan Islands. He was martyred at age 17 alongside Blessed Diego Luis de San Vitores while on mission in Guam and is recognized as the patron saint of Filipino youth.

Early in life, Pedro developed a vibrant and devout faith. He was educated as a catechist and volunteered to accompany Jesuit missionaries to Guam. At age 14 he was chosen alongside other exemplary young catechists to do just that, and he accompanied Spanish Jesuit missionary Diego Luis de San Vitroes to the islands. This Jesuit mission was funded by Maria Ana of Austria, Queen Regent of Spain and was dedicated to the Virgin Mary. During this time in history, the island chain that Guam is associated with would come to be known as the Marianas Islands after the influential Spanish queen. Calungsod's mission, alongside his fellow missionaries, was to catechize those native to the island of Guam — specifically the Chamorro people.

During his missionary efforts, many people were baptized and joined the Christian faith. In a short period of time, Calungsod learned Spanish and developed relationships with the local people, helping to catechize many villages despite harsh conditions, an island territory sometimes difficult to navigate, and often a lack of supplies. It was in 1672 in the village of Tumon when he and San Vitores really ran into trouble.

While in Tumon, an immigrant man from China named Choco who was exiled to Guam due to his criminal acts in Manilla, began to spread rumors among the native peoples. He claimed that the baptismal water used by the missionaries was poisonous and the reason that some sickly infants in the village died. This rumor sank its teeth into the population and, encouraged by the local religious leaders whose power was threatened by the men's missionary work, it inspired intense persecution of the missionaries. Despite this, Calungsod and San Vitores answered the request of the Christian wife of Tumon's chief — Chief Matapang — to baptize their children.

Chief Matapang, believing the rumors started by the exiled man Choco, forbade the baptism and conversation to Catholicism. At his wife's request the missionaries went ahead and still baptized their children while he was out of the house. This enraged the chief and roused him to enlist some fellow villagers to violently attack and kill both Calungsod and San Vitores. It is said that at one point during the attack, Calungsod had a chance to escape but, instead, he did his best to help defend his friend San Vitores and they both perished. Following their deaths Chief Matapang tied them to large boulders and dumped their bodies into the water at Tumon Bay.

Pope John Paul II approved the martyrdom and beatification of St. Calungsod on December 19, 2011, and Pope Benedict canonized him on October 21, 2021, on world Mission Sunday, 340 years after his death. Pope John Paul II hoped that the young martyr's cause for sainthood would be an inspiration to young people everywhere.

STEWARDSHIPTime....Talent.....Treasure



We begin this Holy Week with the reading of the Lord's Passion from the Gospel of Matthew. It is fitting that during this week we intensely focus our minds and hearts on the steps of our Savior as He laid down His very life for

us. But let us also examine the seemingly small acts of stewardship by some who encountered Jesus during this most eventful week.

One occurred when Jesus gave instructions about the room where He would celebrate the Passover. Jesus said, "Go into the city to a certain man and tell him..." 'In your house I shall celebrate the Passover with my disciples." While we do not know this man's name, we do know he agreed to this request — he shared the material gift of his home and the gift of hospitality. Because of his good stewardship, his own home became the site of the institution of the Eucharist!

There was also Simon the Cyrenian, who offered the gift of his physical strength, helping the Lord to carry His Cross. Consider, too, the actions of Joseph of Arimathea — he generously shared a material gift of the tomb that was his, and he gave the gift of service to our Lord by giving Him a proper burial. Then there were the "two Marys" who gave Jesus the gift of their time. Keeping watch in tender vigil after His death, they "remained sitting there, facing the tomb."

Each of these were simple acts of good stewardship, yet God used them in mighty ways. God invites each of us, too, to cooperate with Him in small ways through the sharing of our time, talent, and material gifts. Small gifts can become mighty deeds when placed in God's service.

The 6 Characteristics of an Everyday Stewardship for Lent – Accountable

Easter is only a week away, and churches everywhere in the West are beginning the holiest of weeks. For a moment, even the secular world will bow to religious observances: closings on Good Friday, Easter baskets filled with treats, and television specials featuring Biblical figures. You and I will be reflecting on the meaning of Lent and how we have died and risen with Our Lord, Jesus Christ. Either we have prepared well for this Holy Week observance, or we are left lamenting that maybe next year will be when we get back on track.

The question before us is: "To whom are we accountable?" Did our Lenten observance only have to do with us? Does it matter to anyone if we really took this time seriously or not?

Both faith and community are gifts from God to us. The Church exists so we may live out that faith and respond to God's call, being strengthened by the grace imparted through the sacraments and the community in which we find ourselves. If we are accountable to no one, then the community is simply an option on a Sunday morning, much like golf or household chores. If we are not accountable to God, then our faith is simply something we look to periodically when we are sad or frightened.

However, if we are accountable to each other and to Jesus Christ, then we must answer for our stewardship gifts of faith and community. The Body of Christ is counting on us. Without a strong sense of accountability, we think our actions only affect us. In the end, we are connected to each other through Christ in such a manner that no one ever stands alone.
