A little boy said to his mother: "I couldn't make sister happy, nohow I could fix it. But I made myself happy trying to make her happy."

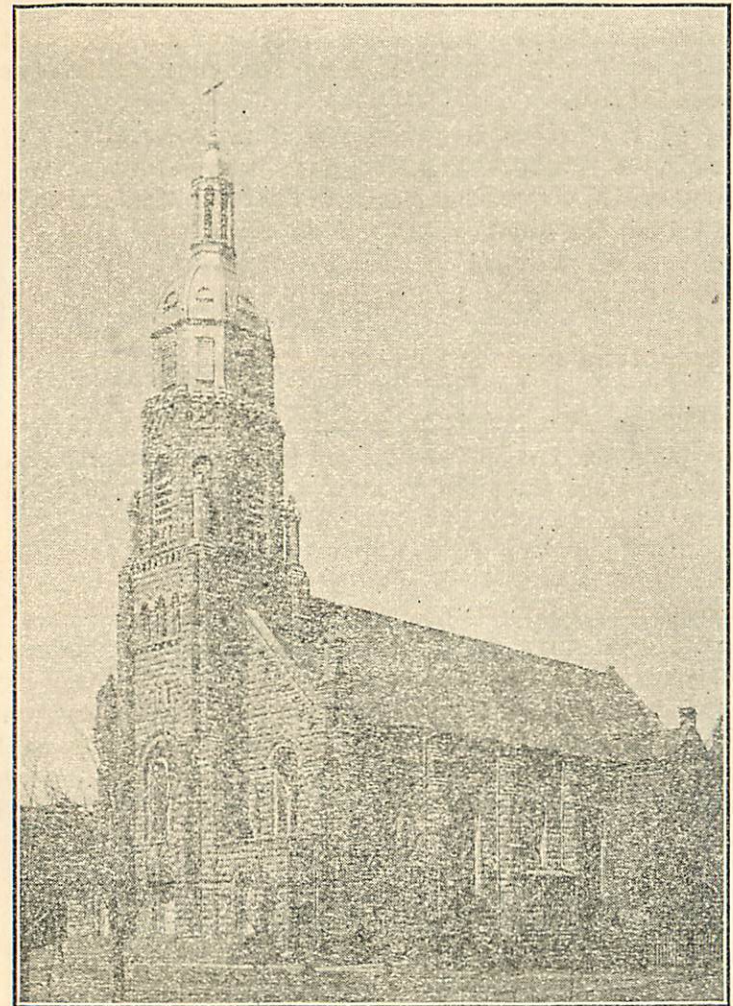
"I make Jim happy, and he laughs," said another boy, speaking of his invalid brother, "and that makes me happy, and I laugh".
