




~ Vatican II Misconceptions~

"This sacred Council has several aims in view: it desires to impart an ever increasing vigor to the Christian life of the faithful; to adapt more suitably to the needs of our own times those institutions which are subject to change; to foster whatever can promote union among all who believe in Christ; to strengthen whatever can help to call the whole of mankind into the household of the Church. The Council therefore sees particularly cogent reasons for undertaking the reform and promotion of the liturgy."

The opening paragraph of *Sacrosanctum Concilium* outlines not only the reasons for this first document from the council, but also the needs of the Church at large during this time. Prior to the council there was a questionnaire that was sent to all the bishops in the world in order to determine the topics to be discussed. It is commonly known that the heads of the departments in the Vatican had prepared many topics for them to discuss and had many documents prepared beforehand. One of the first actions of the council was to throw out the draft documents and start anew in order to get a better vision from the world's bishops. This document on the Liturgy was least effected and thus was the first to be published.

There were 328 speeches given during the 15 meetings from October 11 – December 8, 1962 with 297 comments submitted in writing. All these speeches and comments had to be sifted through in order for the document to be completed. The final document would be approved on December 4, 1963.

I would like for you to notice as we go through this constitution that there are not drastic changes to be done to the liturgy. There will be a call for more vernacular (the language of the people) and greater participation on the part of the faithful in the Mass. These will be the most obvious reforms with which we are familiar. These will be discussed in greater detail as we advance through this constitution.


